7 Tips for Instilling Leadership Skills in your Child:

- Set the Example: By allowing your children to see you balance various aspects of your life demonstrates accountability, strength and leadership.
- Team Activities: Sports/Band/Drama Clubs teamwork activities enhance communication skills, trust, confidence and social skills.
- Show Failures and Emphasize Perseverance: expose children to disappointments, model effective ways to process and accept it, and the importance of moving forward.
- 4. Encourage Negotiation and Decision-Making Skills: assess 'pro's and con's' of situations, discuss the importance of informed decisions, listening to others, and justifying their opinions.
- 5. **Practice Confident Communication:** allow children to order their own meal at the restaurant or asking for something they require from a shop assistant.
- Chores and Work: instilling a good workethic involves children understanding effort vs. reward. Encourage chores and purpose projects.
- 7. **Problem-Solving and Strategic Thinking:** guide with questions and prompts but allow children opportunities to solve problems and form strategies independently. Adapted from: https://www.entrepreneur.com/article/241619


